Annual Global Summit:



Since its beginning in 2009 we have seen steady growth in attendance and participation in our Global Cardio-Oncology Summit (GCOS).

Like so many other organizations, we had to pivot at the last minute in 2020 to host our first VIRTUAL Cardio-Oncology Summit (VCOS 2020). Our friends in Spain led us through an outstanding meeting with over 550 participants from around the world.



Growing our Community through Membership: Our membership has increased tenfold in the last year.


Establishing

Certifying Expertise:



In 2020 we also certified 80 members from 22 different countries through our IC-OS Board Certification Exam. This is the only Certification available in cardio-oncology. Over the past couple of years an international team of experts created a rigorous comprehensive exam.

IC-OS President Dr. Dan Lenihan, had the pleasure of presenting (virtually, of course!) his certificate to the President of IC-OS S. Africa, Dr. Trishun Singh along with IC-OS Poland President Dr. Sebastian Szmit.


