Growth includes the addition of over **300 new members!** We have now passed 600 total members from more than 30 countries across the world. Growth includes **new international chapters** adding Germany, China, Georgia (Tbilisi) and Portugal.

Dr. Matthias Totzeck of Germany comments, "Cardio-Oncology research in Germany has a strong focus on the effects of immune therapies on the cardiovascular system...This includes the conduction of large registries, the development of diagnostic algorithms and the identification of populations at risk. A further goal is the education of the lay public about Cardio-Oncology developments in clinics and research."

Dr. Nino Sharashidze, President of our new Georgian chapter explains, "Major achievements include the establishment of the Georgian Society of Cardio-Oncology (GSCO) and the first specialized Department of Cardio-Oncology at the Institute of Clinical Cardiology, Tbilisi, in 2018...A PhD program in Cardio-Oncology...has been also developed and implemented at the Ivane Javakhishvili Tbilisi State University (TSU)." And from Portugal we learn from Dr. Manuela Fiuza that, "The first dedicated Cardio-Oncology program in Portugal, was established in 2016 at University Hospital Santa Maria, Lisbon. Besides the consultation, we have post-graduate training (level 3) and clinical and translational research, in particular on breast cancer...In 2019, we created the Cardio-Oncology Study Group (GECO) of the Portuguese Society of Cardiology."

All of this has demanded **new staff!** Kathryn Brannan (Tampa, FL, USA) is serving you as our administrative assistant and Dr. Daniel Lenihan moved into the position of Executive Consultant and Immediate Past President. Dr. Susan Dent has replaced Dr. Lenihan as President and Dr. Teresa Lopez-Fernandez has taken the position of Vice-President. These developments strengthen our core leadership and position us to serve our community with broad experience and superior expertise.

Development includes our **new partnership** with **Wondr Medical**, a social



network for health care providers where much of our content is now housed and made broadly accessible. In just a few months of our partnership, we have had over 12,000 visits to our channel. 
